he MEC for Co-operative Governance, Human Settlements & Traditional Affairs (CoGHSTA), Mr Basikopo Makamu has handed over houses to two beneficiaries within the Makhuduthamaga Local Municipality, Ms Elsie Phaahla (63) and Ms Violet Phahlamohlaka (79). Life has not been easy for these two senior citizens as they did not have proper shelter to stay with their families. Their plight changed for the better recently when the MEC for Co-operative

Governance, Human Settlements & Traditional Affairs (CoGHSTA), Mr Basikopo Makamu handed them keys to their brand-new RDP houses. Both beneficiaries survive on social grant provided by government.

Speaking during the handing over, MEC Makamu said the Department continues to implement what is stated in the Freedom Charter which was adopted in 1955. It is stated in the Freedom Charter that *"There Shall be Houses, Security and Comfort for All."* He Said.

He added that " As a nation we have come a long way since the attainment of our democracy, and we are not looking back. The Department will not rest until all deserving beneficiaries have proper shelter".
