COGHSTA FULFILS ITS MANDATE TO ADDRESS HOUSING DELIVERY IN SESHEGO

The Mandela month brought joy to the community of Seshego. The 26th of July 2018 marked as a day to remember for three housing beneficiaries who got then opportunity to meet Human Settlements Minister, Ms Nomaindiya Mfeketo and CoGHSTA MEC, Mr Jerry Ndou. Following the MINMEC meeting aimed at addressing the status of housing in Limpopo, the National Department of Human Settlements Minister and her entourage headed to Seshego Extension 106 to officially hand over houses to selected beneficiaries and 1790 title deeds to Seshego community.

Addressing residents, Minister Mfeketo said that her Department is not only committed to getting rid of informal settlements in the province but ensure that people are housed properly in well located places. She further highlighted that although government has provided over 4.6 million houses since the dawn of democracy, it is still not enough as housing delivery is still a basic need to the impoverished communities in the province. Mr Hendrik Venter, who is one of the three beneficiaries to receive a house on the day, thanked the Minister Mfeketo and MEC Ndou for affording him a newly built home as he

had been homeless. "It is so good to see so many people coming here to celebrate with me. I am grateful to God and feeling so special because now I have a place of my own where I can sleep properly," said the 71 year old pensioner as the minister cut the ribbon to officially handover the house. The event concluded with residents engaging with the Minister and MEC and the handing over of title deeds.
