## MASIA COMMUNITY SET TO RECEIVE STATE OF THE ART TRADITIONAL COUNCIL OFFICES

The MEC for Department of Co-operative Governance, Human Settlements and Traditional Affairs (CoGHSTA), Mr Jerry Ndou hosted a Sod Turning Ceremony at Ha-Masia village on the 11<sup>th</sup> of September 2018.

During the event, Ndou proudly announced that for the next eleven months, the youth, women and people living with disabilities of Masia will benefit through employment and receive training in various disciplines of construction as the community's traditional offices will be built.

Through this R9 million investment towards the construction of Masia Traditional Council offices, I am pleased that the offices will not only be fenced, paved and accessible to all but secured with a guard house for the safety of those working in it," he highlighted.

Speaking on how the construction process will unfold, Mr Maluleke who is the implementing Manager from Public Works said that the Traditional Council structure will consist of the Senior Traditional Leader and Ward Councilor's offices, Traditional Court and other administration offices.

Khosi Masia expressed his gratitude for the new offices that will be built for Masia Traditional Council and that he was confident that the office will serve his community to their satisfaction.

Chairperson for the Limpopo House of Traditional Leaders, Kgoshi Malesela Dikgale said he was relieved that finally the traditional offices of Ha-Masia will soon be built and services will no longer be rendered to community members under trees.
