I greet you,

Thobela,

We are gathered here, as government, traditional authorities, royal families, members of the private sector and community members from surrounding villages alike;

We gather on this special day to offer jubilation and to honour this official inauguration of Kgoshi Seloane Makgope Mofenyi, the son of the late Kgoshi Seloane Sepeke the third.

It is indeed an honour to lead this wonderful ceremony on behalf of our honourable Premier, Chupu Stanley Mathabatha, and our entire Limpopo provincial government.

The Premier would have desired to be physically present with us to oversee your inauguration, however, due to other pressing government commitments, he has asked me to be here in his place.

But rest assured Kgoshi, the Premier has given this event his full support and blessings.

Ladies and gentlemen,

This beautiful event takes place on a special month for our country, it takes place on a month where we come together to honour and appreciate the rich and diverse cultural heritage that defines our beloved nation, South Africa.

The sacrifices of Freedom Fighters, alive and fallen, are suitably honoured.

This government has put resources in place for our African customs and traditions to be protected and promoted.

As government, we are confident that Kgoshi Seloane will follow in the footsteps of those who have gone before him, to work with us in advancing the hopes and dreams of his people.

Ladies and Gentlemen,

Our province has seen a rise in the inauguration of Senior Traditional Leaders that are younger than the usual age that we see. Today, we are delighted to inaugurate Kgoshi Seloane, who may be young in the number of his years, but very matured in the extent of his wisdom.

It is evident that this Royal Family has invested much in the life of Kgoshi Seloane, giving him the necessary nurturing and education, preparing him for the responsibility that is officially confirmed on his shoulders today.

As a Senior Traditional Leader, you have a responsibility to work closely with your local municipality, to identify strategic land for development, supported by municipal planning policies such as the Spatial Development Framework.

We have already witnessed Kgoshi, your commitment to the development of this community through your concentration on road, bridge, and water and sanitation infrastructure. This is the type of traditional leadership we desire to see and work with.

In the same breath, we encourage developers and municipalities to ensure that they include Traditional Leaders in the work of developing the land. There is much potential in advancing gains in agriculture, real estate, and retail.

The inclusion of the community through their Senior Traditional Leaders will unlock much potential.

As government, we pledge our support to working with you Kgoshi, to ensure that yours and our vision for the development of this community is a reality.

As the MEC for COGHSTA, I have witnessed in many occasions instances where recognitions and inaugurations of Senior Traditional Leaders are delayed because of conflicts in royal families.

Accompanied with the delay to inaugurate, is the derailment of the promotion of social cohesion and economic development in the community.

The Seloane Royal family has set an outstanding example for how the transfer of the role of Khosi is meant to be handled by royal houses.

I have also seen at times instances where community members who are not part of the Royal Family attempt to force their opinions on the choosing of an heir in the royal family.

In the same spirit, allow me to honour the contribution of the mother of Kgoshi, Mme Dina Ngwanamohube Seloane, for filling the leadership gap as Acting Senior Traditional Leader for almost 40 years. It is not a small task, and we honour her selfless work.

The IEC will soon announce a date for registration. I encourage everyone here to take responsibility of using your influence to urge your direct families, communities and colleagues to register to vote.

We can only better our country by actively taking part in its democratic processes.

Kgoshi Mofenyi Seloane, here are your people. Lead them with the wisdom and energy we already see in you, walk with them in your mercy and serve them with your humility.
