The moment when Traditional Leadership donate a land for development and urbanization, it means municipality will have tax base and consumption of services will result in revenue collection and assist in the financial viability of the municipality.

What we have to run away from, is the moment in time when our people migrate to areas where there are services, when we could have been proactive and innovative enough to provide our people with better services.

We are talking of bettering the lives of our people. Bettering their lives means we have to engage in active citizenry. Active citizenry that has registered to participate in an election that will say South Africa's rural communities should have a greater opportunities to participate fully in the economic, social and political life of the country.

A lot has been done for our people, for the past 24 years, and we are hopeful that together we will carry the message of the President and raise our hands high and say "Thuma Mina – Send me" to the communities to bring in hope to the hopelessness.

"Thuma Mina – Send Me" to be an ambassador of urbanization and development for the benefit of our people.

Indeed, we should all be agreeing to join hands on the "Thuma Mina – Send Me" call, to build new settlements not far from places of work. This goodwill train of "Thuma Mina – Send Me" inspires us to do more for our people especially on the rural spatial planning.

Our hands are on the deck dealing with sensible and sustainable land reform, support to farmers, roll-out of household services, and appropriate economic infrastructure such as roads and irrigation schemes.

Today we are joined together on a message of hope, as we celebrate the good work done by the First Lady Trust. We appreciate that this family of Bungeni Muxabeni, a mother of two, will today have a roof above their heads and furniture to compliment it.
