## Maseke Community elated over the Inauguration of Kgoshigadi Malatji

As rain clouds gathered, so did the Community Members of Maseke Village under the Ba-Phalaborwa Local Municipality to witness the Inauguration of their Kgoshigadi, Mapula Rossley Malatji on Saturday, 7 September 2019.
