MEC Ndou to inaugurate Hosi Yingwani Samuel Chauke Mtititi

The MEC for the Department of Co-operative Governance, Human Settlements & Traditional Affairs (CoGHSTA), Mr Jerry Ndou will officially inaugurate Hosi Yingwani Samuel Chauke on Friday, 23 March 2018, at Mtititi Village outside Malamulele. Chauke (35) is the first born son of the late Hosi Mzamani Joseph (Hosi Mtititi) and Mthavini Johannah Chauke.

After the death of his father, the late Hosi Chauke (Mtititi) in August 2000, the Chieftaincy was left vacant as the heir apparent/ successor was still young (19 years old) and could not take over as a chief. The family took a resolution to appoint his uncle (his father's younger brother) as the Regent until 2013.

The Mtititi tribe belongs to Vahlengwe clan. The clan originated from Mozambique and moved to Northern Transvaal (Lwamondo) via Zimbabwe. It is in Lwamondo where the conflict between the Vatsonga tribe Vha-Venda started which led to a bitter feud. The feud was resolved by Joao Vahlengwe. They then moved down to Levubu area, and were allocated land in the area called Pfukani in the present day Vuwani. From Pfukani they moved to Mtititi.
